## 2. Meeting Minutes / Additions to Agenda

## 3. NPDES Phase II Permit TMDL and Annual Report Update

- Status of Annual Reporting – Due by October 15, 2017
  - Dagmara Saini, City of Manteca – Completed all online questions and stated it is a smooth process which prompts the upload of required documentation. The required documents consist of 3 attachments: 1) Program Effectiveness Assessment (PEA) – a summary and comparison of the Program Effectiveness Assessment and Improvement Plan (PEAIP) previously submitted; 2) Hotspots; and, 3) Drainage System Maintenance for catch basins.
  - Kat Garcia, City of Lodi – In the process of submitting documents to WGR Consultants.

## 4. Update on Trash Policy Requirements (Group)

- Any updates?
  - Hamid Parsa, Mountain House Community Services District (MHCS D) – The manufacturer of their catch basin equipment, Inventive Resources, Inc., has submitted the filter insert specifications to the Water Board for approval. All MHCS D catch basin capture devices must be installed by December 2018. The MHCS D catch basins were part of the Mountain House design, but have not yet been approved by the Water Board as a trash capture device. These multi-media filters contain layers of foam, carbon, and screens with maintenance provided by the manufacturer on a monthly basis, as well as after every rain event.
  - Stephanie Reyna-Hiestand, City of Tracy, discussed the different types of catch basins based upon the amount of flow and volume intake. Lynn Hoffman, San Joaquin County, commented that San Joaquin County Public Works is considering adding catch basins to the list of conditions for new development, thus understanding the various systems, costs, and O&M is beneficial.

- Online registration is closed for the conference. There is limited registration available for the workshops on Monday, September 25<sup>th</sup>. Webcast is also available.
  
- [Storm Water Awareness Week October 9-13, 2017: \[stormwaterawareness.org\]\(http://stormwaterawareness.org\)](#)
- A “traveling” multi-workshop event with locations throughout the state hosted by WGR Southwest. The theme is “On the Road with Stormwater” with focus on education and outreach. Interviewed were Kat Martinez and Kathy Grant on the City of Lodi’s outreach efforts and grass roots Farmer’s Market.
  
- Danielle Barney, San Joaquin County, reported on San Joaquin County’s Coastal Cleanup Day 2017 which was held on Saturday, September 16, 2017, and was the 18<sup>th</sup> consecutive year the County has participated. This year, totals included 15 cleanup sites throughout the County, 898 cleanup volunteers, and 22,232 pounds of trash and debris removed from the local inland waterways. In conclusion, the amount of trash being dumped has lessened since 2016 and the annual cleanup and outreach efforts are making a difference in the communities. Dagmara Saini expressed interest for the City of Manteca participating in 2018. Additional discussion included reaching out in 2018 to the Stockton Rowing Club, and local high schools for volunteers.

## 6. SJVSWQP Committee Update (Group)

- Kat reported she has not received any requested documents (i.e. fliers, brochures) from the agencies, regarding their trash outreach efforts, for collaboration on media projects. Discussion included involvement of the Solid Waste divisions of the respective agencies. Kathy said that waste hauler companies contracted with Lodi Unified School District have placed 3 bins in the schools: 1) Food (organics); 2) Recyclables; and, 3) Other. Discussion included that waste hauler companies, in the Bay Area and Sacramento areas, are also participating in this type of trash sorting in efforts to create compostable waste. Stephanie reiterated for each agency to contact their Solid Waste divisions for educational outreach literature specific to

trash. The intent is to collaborate the collected information and create one all-inclusive flier containing all agency logos and branding the group as a “team” against trash.

## o Training

- o Kat reported that the Regional Training will be held on Thursday, May 17, 2018 at Hutchins Street Square in Lodi. The event will run from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. and may include lunch, at a cost of \$55.00 per person. The training will consist of 2 parts: Part 1 – Engineering and City Management; and Part 2 – Labors and “Boots on the Ground” with trash related topics including Coastal Cleanup Day – “Not Just Once a Year,” Trash Capture Systems, Good Housekeeping – “When Your Mom Isn’t Looking,” Detection and Elimination, Best Management Practices, Corp Yard – “What Goes on in the Corp Yard, Stays in the Corp Yard,” Inspectors – “Make Your Site Ready 24-7,” Violations Enforcements and Fines, and Bills. Kathy added that Danielle Barney, San Joaquin County, has been invited to speak on Coastal Cleanup Day. Other presentations being considered may include vendors of full-capture systems.
- o Kat mentioned media advertising in Spring 2018, which could include information on the Regional Training. Concerns were raised regarding radio advertisement would reach the general public audience and not a viable option due to the limited capacity and/or cost of the training.

## 7. New Business

- o Karen Ashby, LWA, provided history of the State-wide pilot study to evaluate, characterize, and understand what methodologies can be used and what constituents of emerging concern (CEC)s are being picked up in wastewater and stormwater discharges. Thus, monitoring was conducted in the Bay Area, southern and northern California on a mostly wastewater perspective, with some stormwater monitoring in the Bay Area. Karen commented that the State’s focus seems directed towards the Central Valley and monitoring of the CECs. A new pilot study is being negotiated through the State Board and Delta-centric, wastewater, and stormwater agencies. A final work plan is expected and, likely, funnelled through the Delta Regional Monitoring Program (RMP), with estimated annual costs up to \$100-250K. Funding is unknown, however the Regional Board has stated this is a Central Valley Regional Water Board study (Redding to Bakersfield) thereby all the wastewater agencies in Phase 1 and Phase 2 may be obligated to help fund the study.

Discussion amongst the group included: CEC issues should not be isolated to the Central Valley and not representative of what is occurring in the Delta; the studies will result in regulations; funding; monitoring locations; and, California’s stringent environmental regulations.
