- Website Redesign: Sub-Committee Update:** Sonia explained that the web design is moving forward well. A consultant is helping with a remake of the partnership logo. The slogan currently on the website mock-up is, "Working Together to Protect Our Valley's Water". If you have a suggestion for something different please submit to the group for consideration. The City of Tracy is currently managing the website and will continue to do so in the future.
- Cost Share Agreement Update:** Only minor edits have been made since the last update. The agreement is ready to be submitted for a vote as soon as all members of the group have reviewed it. The agreement contains a signatory page that must be signed by each member and returned to the group. Each member of the group may need to get their City Council's or their City Manager's approval. It was suggested that a copy of the agreement be added to the website as a link.
Sonia created a PowerPoint presentation that she will be putting before the Patterson City Council on 7.18.2023 that explains the benefits of the partnership and a cost analysis. She will share this with the group and may also record the presentation as she presents it so that it can be shared with other members of the partnership.
- NPDES Phase II Permit: Discuss any known updates:** Karen Ashby – state water board is releasing sections of the draft phase II permit. The Casqa subcommittee has a way to sign up and participate in the review and to comment. Casqa is engaged in having conversations with board staff about the permit. There are a lot of substantial changes being proposed. LWA is looking at the detail in each section. She suggested discussing in a future meeting. We will need to provide formal written comments back as soon as the process has been completely opened up.

8. CASQA Updates:

- a. **CASQA /OWOW Participation** - The central valley group has 20 phase II agencies and 2 phase I participating. Subscription good through April of 2024. OWOW supporter orders were placed in Jan new orders will be placed in the next month or so. The next formal OWOW meeting will be this Monday. If you want to participate let her know and she will forward the invite to you. She will send out a summary of the highlights of the meeting. LWA is working with people to establish the IPM advocate Julie Barber who is very active in the central valley and in holding training sessions. Kathryn Reyes adds that she and Sonia are working together to host Julie for trainings. Sonia will record it for sharing with the group. May add it to the website as part of a training library.
- b. **Annual Conference** - We look forward to seeing you at the Paradise Point Resort in San Diego, September 11-13, 2023! 9. Delta RMP Update by Sonia: Sonia was assigned to the board of directors to represent our group and she is on the executive committee. They have been discussing budget, vacancies due to retirements, you may receive emails requesting nominations, they are updating their SOPs as per the requirements from the regional board. She says overall it is going well and she wants to do a good job being a representative for the group

10. CV Salts: Karen Ashby – Watching for valley wide assessment that is ongoing to look at different types of contributions primarily salt vs nitrate. Stormwater is a source. Stormwater may have a large load with large storm events, volume, it may not be reflective of high salt concentrations. She wants to ensure that SW isn't tagged for the costs associated with CV Salts.

11. New Business:

SWMP - Patterson has not completed one in a long while as their permit hasn't changed. With the new MS4 they may need to do an update.

Pyrethroid Management Plan - Stockton - Our PMP was only a draft. We had an extension with the state until 6.30.2023. We have a completed Administrative directive and will be resubmitting by the end of the month.

Coastal Clean-Up - There will be a site captain meeting today at 1:30pm with the county. If you would like to participate reach out to Tameka Miller.

Advertisement Options - Sonia - we only have radio ads and our website. We talked about other possibilities, Sonia will keep this on her radar and bring more information as it is available.

Kathy city of Lodi – Working with Caltrans and to use the same ad campaign art on busses, bus shelters, etc. about dog waste, pesticides, and their social media tool kit to use if they want to push out some of the same messaging through social media, it's nearly free. They can add the city logo to the artwork so it looks professional. Must pay for installation. Kathy will send an email to everyone, however, it is on the Caltrans website.
