March 28th, 2018 Meeting Minutes

1. Welcome/ Sign In
Sign In- Sheet attached- No approval of previous agendas were conducted.
2. Committee provided an update to SJVSQP on their discussion of
 - Committee member roles and responsibilities.
 - Committee meetings, (Meetings will be quarterly either in person or via teleconference).
 - Committee member roles:
 - I. IT Admin – Caleb (Tracy)
 - II. Financial Admin – Lisa Smith and Kathy Grant
 - III. Secretary Admin – Each city is still responsible for Agenda, meeting minutes, phone for meeting call in, but if assistance is needed they will reach out to this person. (Still need volunteer)
3. Partnership discussion on Trash Full Capture Equivalency and On-Land Visual Trash Assessments (OVTA).
 - CASQA trainings were attended by several members who reported that trainings were informative and should be attended by members if new dates become available.
 - Attendees of CASQA training stated that not all streets need to be walked and that parking lots are considered private and also do not have to be assessed.

- Partnership members provided updates on their status of identifying PLU and selected locations and land uses. Most members stated that they have not yet started the OLVTA because they have not yet attended the CASQA trainings. Partnership members discussed implementation plans and different strategies that may be taken to achieve full capture system equivalency (FCSE).
 - Discussion by partnership members on 5mm screens needed on all overflow.
 - Partnership members were informed of a calculator that has been made available for quantification of trash.
 - Partnership members discussed sharing flyers of Potential BMPs with partnership and to post to the website.
 - Partnership members discussed Creek Cleanups and their ability to give a 10% of what you collect as a credit towards full capture. Discussion if school cleanups will be acceptable for credit. Contact Chris Summer EOAC was provided in discussion.
